

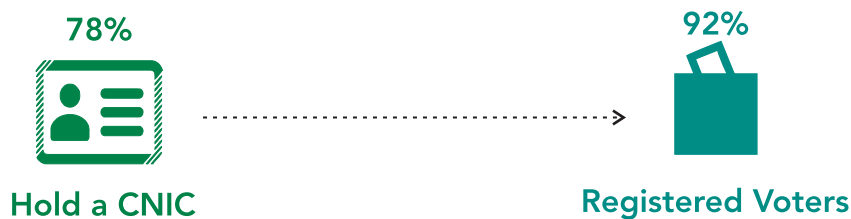

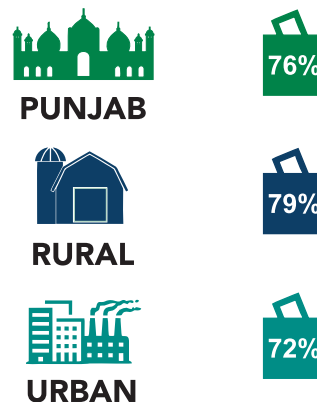

CNIC and Voter Registration



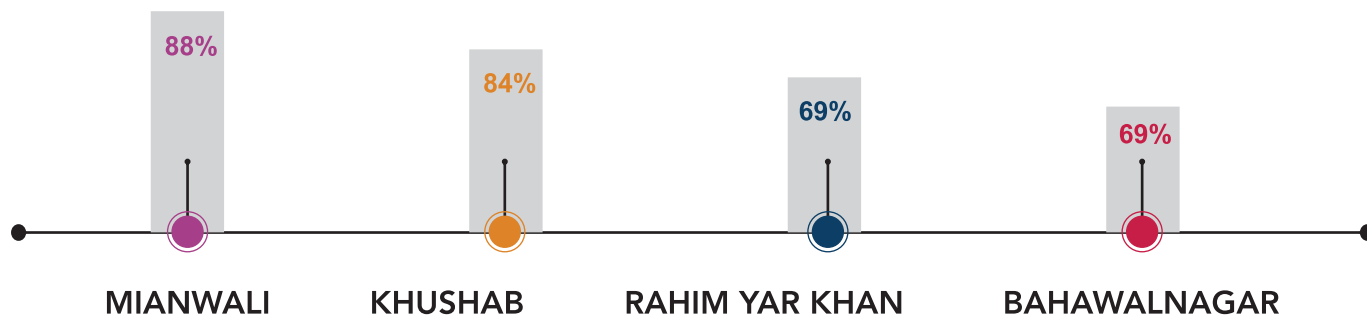
Voted in 2018 General Elections



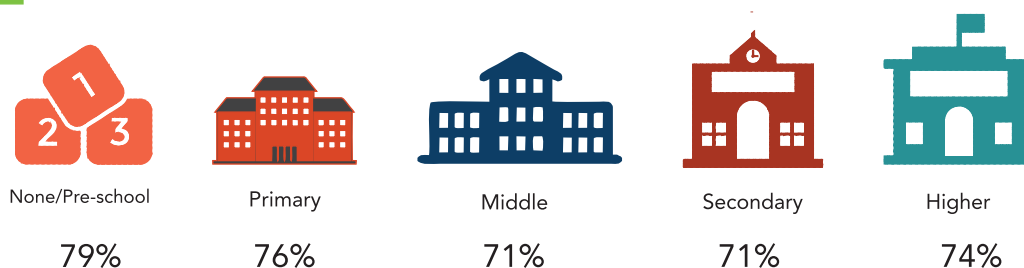
In Punjab 92% of CNIC - holders are registered voters.

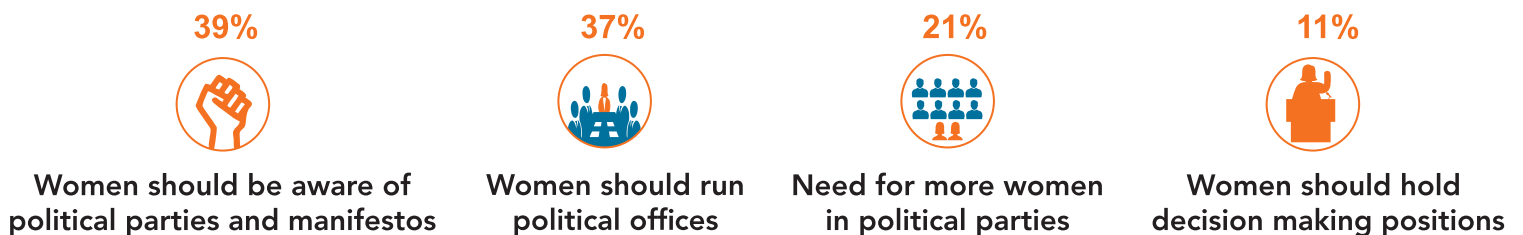
